- Currently enrolled dietetic interns desiring a graduate degree.

- Major GPA above a 3.0 and cumulative GPA above a 3.0. Your major GPA should include your major class as well as all of your math and science classes.

Cost

Effective Fall 2024:

Credit hour cost is a flat rate for in-state and out of state students. The cost is \$600.00/credit hour + required fees.
