

(b) FY26 One-Time Request: Expanded Retention Efforts

Background and Overview

The Center for Student Empowerment (CSE) respectfully submits this proposal to expand retention-focused initiatives in collaboration with Student Housing & Residential Life (SHRL) and enhance support for high-need student populations.

CSE serves as a crucial resource for students navigating academic, personal, and financial challenges. As demand for services grows each semester, this modest but strategic funding request will allow CSE to enhance programming, expand outreach, and deepen our impact on student success and retention — with a particular focus on students living on campus who may need additional support to persist and graduate.

Expansion of Retention Initiatives with SHRL

With targeted funding, CSE proposes to expand the following key efforts in collaboration with SHRL:

Enhancement: Increase peer mentoring hours and provide academic workshops for students in the core retention groups.

Impact: Build community, reduce isolation, and improve persistence among this at-risk population.

1. Joint Engagement Events

Enhancement: Host 2–3 targeted events per semester focused on retention-related topics (financial literacy, mental health, midterm preparation, and career planning).

Impact: Foster belonging, equip students with life skills, and encourage persistence through critical points in the semester.

2. Resource Navigation & Referrals

Enhancement: Develop quick-reference resource guides and conduct proactive outreach to connect students to available support.

Impact: Help students resolve crises earlier, reducing the risk of academic withdrawal.
